ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands

Introduction

- The world's first ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands is the Museum of Creativity, where the creative processes at the heart of art and science and their role in shaping society are explored.
- With a form reminiscent of the lotus flower, ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands has been called "The Welcoming Hand of Singapore" by Mr. Sheldon Adelson, chairman of Las Vegas Sands Corp.
- Designed by renowned architect Moshe Safdie, the iconic ArtScience Museum hosts blockbuster international exhibits as well as permanent exhibits on three floors of gallery space across 6,000 square metres. Renowned exhibitions have included *Titanic: The Artifact Exhibition* (Oct 2011), *Cartier Time Art* (Dec 2011), *Andy Warhol: 15 Minutes Eternal* (March 2012), *Harry Potter: The Exhibition™* (June 2012), *Outside In: A Magnum Photos Showcase* (Oct 2012), *The Art of the Brick* (Nov 2012), *Mummy: Secrets of the Tomb* (April 2013), *Essential Eames: A Herman Miller Exhibition* (June 2013), *50 Greatest Photographs of National Geographic* (Aug 2013), *Dinosaurs: Dawn to Extinction* (January 2014) and *Annie Leibovitz A Photographer's Life 1990–2005* (April 2014)
- There are 21 galleries in total.
- The roof of ArtScience Museum allows rainwater to be harvested and channeled down through the centre of the structure to the reflecting pond at the lowest level of the building. Rainwater is recycled and redirected through the water feature to create a continuous cylindrical waterfall. The rainwater is also recycled for use in the museum's bathrooms as part of Singapore's Green Mark program.
- Surrounded by a 4,000 square metre lily pond reflecting pool, ArtScience Museum floats over a dynamic new urban terrace with commanding views of Singapore and Marina Bay Sands.

Fast Facts

- There are a total of 10 "fingers" that make up the building form plus two bay windows with special views of Singapore and Marina Bay Sands.
- The interiors of the "fingers" are unique gallery spaces with natural lighting from the fingertips illuminating the sculptural interior wall forms.
- The tallest "finger" stands 60 metres above ground.
- The fingers' primary surfaces are made of special Glass Fiber Reinforced Polymer (GFRP), which has never been used in a project in Singapore. The material is typically used in the skins of high-performance racing yachts.

Community Outreach and Thought Leadership

- ArtScience Museum conducts regular educational programs for both children and adult visitors. Activities include talks, forums, workshops, and tours of the museum.
- There is an International Advisory Board that aims to further develop and evolve the ArtScience content and positioning of the museum.

Visitor Information

- Ticket prices range from SGD8 to SGD28. There are concession rates for children aged 2–12 years old and senior citizens aged 65 years old and above.
- The ticketing structure permits same-day re-entry for visitors who wish to break between exhibitions for meals and shopping.
- ArtScience Museum opens from 10a.m. to 7p.m. daily, last admission at 6p.m, including public holidays.
