Where we fly from the UK and exciting new routes:

- **The only airline to offer direct low-cost long-haul flights from the UK to the U.S.** with flights from Gatwick to **New York, Los Angeles, Orlando and Fort Lauderdale** from as little as £149
- **Boston will be added** to Norwegian's low-cost long-haul network from Gatwick in March 2016
- **New thrice weekly flights from Gatwick to San Francisco-Oakland** launch in May 2016

- Flights from Gatwick to **Puerto Rico** launched in **November 2015** offering UK passengers low-cost travel to the Caribbean for the first time

How Norwegian 'took off' in the UK:

- **June 2003:** Launches its first UK route – Oslo to London Stansted
- **October 2007:** Introduces its first flight from London Gatwick (to Stavanger)
- **April 2013:** Establishes its first UK base at London Gatwick
- **July 2014:** Introduces UK's first low-cost, long-haul flights to the U.S
- **November 2015:** Granted a UK AOC and Operating license to form Norwegian UK subsidiary
- **March 2016:** Low-cost flights from London Gatwick to Boston to launch
- **May 2016:** Low-cost flights from London Gatwick to San Francisco-Oakland launch
- **2017:** Norwegian will be the European launch customer of Boeing 737 MAX8 aircraft making it possible to connect smaller cities in the UK with destinations in the U.S.
